I remember the eye-opening experience of my freshman music history classes in 1975 at University of Connecticut, Storrs: Mus. His. 101 & 102 with Dr. Bruce Bellingham. I loved how he introduced each period by comparing architecture, visual art and music from ancient Greek times to medieval times, through the Renaissance, Baroque and forward.

At holiday time, the vocal majors at UCONN were asked to perform in the yearly 'Renaissance Christmas' festival, which ran for two weeks every December. Each performance was complete with the Lord and Lady of the Court leading the proceedings with food, drink, merriment and song. Scholarly Renaissance instrumentalists from Boston to Yale University would be on hand as the backup band, I mean the Courtly musicians.

Pianists, like me, were relegated to sitting in the audience as there was absolutely NOTHING for us to contribute. (The piano had not been conceived of yet and what do you do with X number of undergraduate pianists anyway?) So, I sat mesmerized by the costumes, the dialog, the gorgeous, open, clear intonations of the viols and viola da gambas and recorders and shawms and maybe even a sackbut. The audience was carried along as minor cast members in a theater production. For me, this was a profound, exciting time for me, replete with captivating haunting, new sonic experiences. Ah, what a fun memory from soooooo long ago now.

This was the inspiration for choosing Collegium Musicum for my performing ensemble instead of the choral group. I still remember practicing virginal pieces on the harpsichord and singing and playing recorder on Belle qui tiens ma vie from Orchesography by Thoinot Arbeau.
