#### Bio for Natsuki Fukasawa:

Steinway Artist, Natsuki Fukasawa, has performed in Australia, Brazil, China, Denmark, England, Hong Kong, Israel, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, and the U.S. She is a recipient of the Best Chamber Music Recording of the Year from the Danish Music Awards. Dr. Fukasawa teaches at both University of the Pacific Conservatory of Music and at UC Davis, and serves on the artist faculty for the Talis Festival and Academy in Bosnia and Orfeo Music Festival in the Italian Alps. She also enjoys nurturing young talents in her own private studio, where her students' accomplishments include appearances in the NPR show From the Top, winning top prizes in Chopin National Competition, MTAC Young Artist Guild, Philadelphia International Competition, and go on to pursue music in college.

# CONDOLENCES TO THE BECKER FAMILY

The following is the obituary for Barbara Becker:

Barbara Becker (Née Stein) of Walnut Creek, CA, passed away on February 24th 2024. Born in Chicago, Il, Barbara was the daughter of Elva and Alfred Stein, and youngest sister to Georgann Gutman and Rosemary Pokrass. Barbara was an accomplished pianist, teacher, and awardwinning, commissioned composer. She was composer-in-residence in 1993 at the University of Wisconsin (Madison) where her musical narrative, "I Am Not Virginia Woolf," was performed by faculty. She had been the on-going composer-in-residence for the Contra Costa Chapter of the Music Teachers' Association of California (MTAC) and for many years was the columnist on improvisation for MTAC's state magazine. Additionally, she was listed in Maurice Hinson's Guide to the Pianist's Repertoire as a composer of 20th and 21st-century piano music. Barbara Becker and music have been synonymous since childhood. By age the four she had spontaneously begun playing by ear and arranging nursery rhymes on the piano. It was discovered she had been born with perfect pitch. Private lessons continued throughout high school and summers were spent at the prestigious National Music Camp in Interlochen, Michigan. Admission to the Conservatory at Oberlin College in Ohio started her college career which ended at Roosevelt University in Chicago. Her teaching career began in the Chicago area public schools and continued in South San Francisco as a music specialist where, in addition to teaching classroom music, she wrote and arranged music for choral groups and created imaginative programs for holidays and school events. Upon moving to the San Francisco East Bay, Barbara saw a need in the community for a preschool music program. She created within Walnut Creek Civic Arts, the Stepping Stones program. It was the first pre-music program of its kind in Northern California, and it had a waiting list of over 500 children. It flourished for 16 years until she left to open her own private piano studio. She continued to maintain an active piano studio in the Walnut Creek area, passing on her love for music and piano to her students. She also continued to give back to the community by hosting workshops on improvisation to teacher groups and performing for clubs, organizations, senior residences and other social events.

Barbara is survived by her daughter Julie Boe (Jonathan), her beloved granddaughter Sarah Boe (with whom she was so proud), nephews Tom (Joan) Gutman, Andrew (Sharon) Pokrass, and niece Ellen Wagner. She was treasured by her family, friends, and students.
