

Diablo Symphony season:

The Diablo Symphony Orchestra is excited to open its 2023-24 season at the Lesher Center for the Arts on Sunday, Sept. 17, with a concert featuring solo pianist and teacher Randall Benway, and hopes many area music students will be able to enjoy the special program as well. Beginning at 2 p.m., the program includes Beethoven's lyrical Piano Concerto No. 4, as well as Jean Sibelius's Symphony No. 1 and orchestral tone poem "Finlandia." The piano solo that opens the concerto, the solidary clarinet and timpani passage that opens the symphony, and the hymn-like melody of "Finlandia" (later adopted for the hymn "Be Still My Soul") characterize a program that brings innovation, compelling rhythms, and strikingly beautiful melodies to the stage.

Details of this concert, as well as information about the symphony's new season, are found on its website at www.diablosymphony.org. In addition to the September 17 concert, the season offers:

• Tickets for individual concerts are \$40 for adults and \$10 for youth 13–17 (or 18 for youth still in high school). Children 12 and under are free, and a discount of \$30 each is available for groups of 10 or more seniors. Season and individual tickets can be purchased at the Lesher Center for the Arts box office (925-943-7469; 1601 Civic Drive, Walnut Creek), or online through the DSO's website at https://www.diablosymphony.org/2023-2024-season-joy-beauty-and-all-that-jazz/.

Insurance Information and Fees for Studio Recitals at Orinda Community Church (OCC)

August 21, 2023

Dear Members.

The following information relates to the use of Orinda Community Church (OCC) for your studio recitals.

CCMTAC has an agreement with OCC whereby CCMTAC members can hold their personal studio recitals at OCC for the rate of \$170. Additionally, you will write a check for \$30 made payable to CCMTAC. This new charge, as promised, goes directly to





repayment of the loan and maintenance for our new Steinway piano housed in the Fellowship Hall.

Liability insurance for Studio recitals:

- 1.) OCC requires proof of liability insurance to anyone renting their facilities (as do many other venues). This can be called a Certificate of Insurance (COI).
- 2.) CCMTAC and MTAC DO NOT COVER this liability insurance for individual member purposes. CCMTAC holds liability coverage for branch events, but NOT for events held by individual members for their own businesses. When you call OCC to schedule your recital, you will be asked to obtain a COI. It is your responsibility to do so. Again, CCMTAC and MTAC do not provide this coverage.

Potential resources for obtaining liability insurance:

- 1) Contact your own insurance agent to discuss your business liability needs and coverage, including studio events held outside your home.
- 2) Obtain event insurance from a resource such as <u>eventhelper.com</u>. Such vendors offer insurance for one single event at a time. Search online for "event insurance". **Note:** Event insurance is needed only if you cannot obtain the requisite COI (Certificate of Insurance) from your business policy.
- 3) Search online for "small business liability insurance". You will find many potential vendors listed.

Final thoughts:

Although, this year, rentals are more expensive, you will find OCC is still a less-expensive option. FYI: Many teachers recoup their recital expenses by charging a recital fee.
