Mr. Denk is a concert pianist and skilled writer. He has tasked himself with explaining in words what melody, harmony and rhythm are, as he weaves the story of growing up and into the artist he is today. His explorations are apt and insightful for the musician and non-musician alike. Not an easy task. Each chapter has a listening list as he explains his sometimes irreverent and humorous opinions of these pieces, his teachers and conservatory life. I recommend this book. And his playing is so fresh sounding.
